

## Palaeontology and evolution in terrestrial and marine environments of northwestern Venezuela

This excursion involves activities in several field sites, aiming at developing an understanding of the evolution of marine, near-shore and terrestrial animal communities in the Caribbean region, in particular in the last 10 million years of the northern coast of Venezuela. We will work in fossiliferous exposures of several geological formations in the Paraguana Peninsula and in the Urumaco region, collecting and identifying diverse invertebrate and vertebrate groups. We will visit the local Zoo and fish market to take a look at the extant fauna of the region: the visit to the coastal areas will allow us a comparison among extinct and recent communities. Activities will involve talks, demonstrations and short practical projects such as dissection of fish, processing and identification of palaeontological samples, making of casts of vertebrate fossils, and study of geological sections. Language will be English, those with knowledge of Spanish will certainly have the chance to practice. We will work in close collaboration with Venezuelan colleagues. This course is aimed at advanced Bachelor students with special interest in palaeontology and/or organismal biology and most likely aiming at conducting Master work in this area of Biology/Geology.

*Prerequisites*: BIO 121, other course(s) in one or all of these disciplines: Zoology / Evolution / Palaeontology.

Costs: CHF 1800 per person (to cover airfares to and inside Venezuela, all airport taxes, all other costs except a few low-cost meals). The course organiser will subsidize most of the transportation, accommodation, and logistical costs.
